The team has also had support with coding from Martin Evans and parents have been

very supportive with the homework required and by joining team meetings.

They have been working hard to learn how to code a robot and have undertaken an innovative project to improve a building or public space in the community.

The children decided that they wanted to make play-parks more inclusive. They conducted research in their school community and the school community at Anna Ritchie to design a swing set that is accessible for all.

The most important aspect of the challenge is the core values of inclusion, discovery, impact, innovation, teamwork and fun! This has complimented Clerkhill

School values and has developed transferrable skills in the children.

The culmination of their efforts involved a regional tournament at NESCOL in Fraserburgh where they demonstrated their skills and presented their project.
